

30th Anniversary

30 Years of Giving, £49M of Impact

In 2025, the Heart of England Community Foundation proudly celebrated our 30th anniversary. For 30 years we have had the privilege of serving and championing local communities and grassroots organisations who are transforming lives across the West Midlands and Warwickshire.

In our first five years of operation, the Foundation awarded around £213,000 to local organisations, but fast forward to 2024, and we have awarded more than £49 million in the form of around 14,000 grants.

In 2023/24, we were able to successfully deliver the largest grants programme in our history, the Inclusive Communities Fund — a Commonwealth Games legacy fund which resulted in our busiest year to date. Throughout recent years the Foundation has also regularly managed over 67 funds and programmes on behalf of private donors, businesses and local authorities and awarded more than £5 million in grants.

The Notables were invited to perform at the celebration event as one of the long-term beneficiaries of the Foundation.

It's incredible to see the Foundation reach such a significant milestone.

We could not have achieved this without the generosity of our donors and the incredible team at the Foundation, all of which are hugely passionate about the voluntary and community sector and believe in the power of local giving.

The money we have distributed has helped countless grassroots charities and organisations and has made a positive difference to the lives of millions of people right across the West Midlands and Warwickshire.

We're extremely ambitious and want to continue our work impacting communities across our area, so here's to the next 30 years and beyond!

Grant Spotlight | Refugee and Migrant Centre



Finding Home as a Refugee

Established in 1999, the Refugee and Migrant Centre (RMC) is an award-winning Wolverhampton based charity, and their vision is to create "a society where newcomers feel welcome, valued and lead dignified lives."

RMC recognises that for many of the refugees and migrants who live in the West Midlands, their only goal is to lead a safe and peaceful life. However, refugees are often faced with the daunting challenge of communicating in a new language.

The low levels of spoken English present throughout the refugee community inhibits successful integration within society, not only acting as a physical barrier but also as a psychological barrier — immediately indicating a person's differing cultural background.

RMC received a £7,380 grant extension from the Know Your Neighbourhood Fund (KYN). KYN is a DCMS-backed programme designed to reduce chronic loneliness



and boost volunteering in England's most disadvantaged areas. Launched in January 2023, the fund initially allocated up to £30 million (with £19 million government funding plus match contributions) running through March 2025. Due to its success, the fund was later extended until March 2026 with an additional £4.5 million.

With their grant extension, RMC have been able to continue successfully delivering 'English as a second language' (ESOL) classes to more than 30 students each day. Every class is organised and delivered by passionate volunteers, and once participants have successfully completed their classes, RMC empowers them to return as volunteers to help build their confidence in a time that can be volatile and overwhelming.

Yet, integration is more than a language. RMC has found that their refugee and migrant participants are eager to go one step further and get directly involved in activities designed to enhance the places they now call home. With their grant extension, RMC have also begun partnering with local charities and organising volunteering opportunities so they can learn how to volunteer in a safe environment.

I came to the UK because I was not safe in Kuwait. In Kuwait you do not have any rights. We cannot work. We cannot travel. We cannot get hospital treatment. We are stateless.

Now I am safe. When I first came to RMC, I could not speak any English. Now I can speak, read, write and understand quite well. I help the other students from Kuwait in my ESOL class.

Their participants have been able to volunteer with the likes of The National Trust and the Wild Side Activity Centre and partake in green space restoration projects designed to benefit entire communities.

RMC continue to offer free, impartial and confidential advice and assistance to beneficiaries in Wolverhampton and the wider Black Country who have arrived or migrated from 162 different countries. Thanks to RMC's consistent support and determination, the lives of real people, from real places, are improving every day.



The Joy of Volunteering

Based in Wolverhampton, Access to Business provide professional services supporting local people into employment. One of their most recent projects, utilising their £7,380 Know Your Neighbourhood grant extension, involved developing the Wolverhampton Access 4 All (WA4A) volunteering coordination group.

The group was created to act as a user-led network, where long-standing beneficiaries could guide new beneficiaries to start a successful and fruitful volunteering journey — a journey designed to grant vulnerable and isolated individuals with the skills they need to become proactive members of society again.

A Project Coordinator at Access to Business, said:

"This work has shown just how powerful lived experience can be in helping others take their first steps into volunteering. WA4A has not only built a supportive community, it has also empowered people to turn their own journeys into pathways for others. The impact has been real, lasting, and deeply personal.

When people who have faced the same challenges come together to guide others, it creates something far more meaningful than any advice we could give alone. This funding hasn't just supported a project, it's helped grow a movement

of empathy, confidence, and community-led change. Ultimately, it has enabled us to develop more opportunities for a chance to enhance social inclusion, improve overall confidence, and gain practical experience for all participants in the future."

The group enrolled and trained ten individuals monthly on topics such as: how to identify social opportunities, accessing local support services, AI and fundraising. The wide variety of topics covered meant individuals were gaining skills that would aid them in their personal lives as well as their professional pursuits.





After coming to the UK from Ukraine due to the war, I had nothing. I was at the lowest I have ever been, but Access to Business gave me hope and a future. If it wasn't for Jess and Jas, I would not be here now.

Access to Business further utilised their grant extension by offering specific professional support for their beneficiaries, offering a free job club on Fridays and 1-1's

for those in need of tailored support.

Access to Business has been a lifeline for some of Wolverhampton's most vulnerable individuals. They are a reminder of the transformational impact that can occur when personal barriers such as mental health and social isolation are lifted.



You're as Young as You Feel

Over the past year, we have distributed a total of £79,634 through the Coventry Building Society Fund, which was designed to support local community-based projects in Coventry. With a focus on addressing isolation and vulnerability, charities and community groups could apply for up to £10,000 to support projects based in the local area. Coundon Care Seniors Club are one of 14 organisations that have been funded through the programme this year. Their dedicated team have been tackling loneliness by providing care and companionship to their elderly visitors since 1984.

Coundon Care Seniors Club supports older people above the age of 65, welcoming them with a warm, friendly atmosphere, home-cooked meals, and fab entertainment. The service is offered for 50% less than comparable day care facilities in the city to ensure it is accessible to those in need.



Whilst many of their members suffer from dementia, loneliness and limited mobility, the Coundon Care team help to shoulder this responsibility, giving respite not only to their visitors, but to their families and carers alike. Recently, the senior's club has drawn attention from across the globe through their viral TikTok videos.

Like many community-based organisations, Coundon Care Seniors Club relies on donations and grant funding to deliver their incredible work. In 2024, a grant of £1,970 was awarded to Coundon Care for the procurement of essential kitchen equipment. As a part of the refurbishment of their centre in Tile Hill, Coventry, a new commercial dishwasher and refrigerator were purchased to help meet the demand for their services, which has grown in recent years.



The new facilities will enable the Coundon Care team to more efficiently cater for a larger number of visitors, which will in turn give support staff more time to tend to their vulnerable members.

Kay Smith has been involved with Coundon Care for almost 10 years. At first, Kay had only planned to stay at the centre for a short time, but like many, she was captivated by the centre's warm, family atmosphere. The centre has become a lifeline for the many families it supports, giving its visitors the chance to forget any personal barriers they may be facing and simply have fun.

Inspiring Sustainable **Action**

Based in Solihull, IM Properties is one of the UK's largest private property developers and investors. Since their establishment in 1987, they have become industry leaders in sustainable construction. Embedded in their work is a commitment to leaving behind a tangible legacy across the communities they operate in.

Our partnership with IM Properties sprung from our shared mission to help local causes that matter. The Peddimore Community Fund was launched in 2018, with the aim of supporting projects local to the Peddimore Employment Park based in the North-East of Birmingham. They have since expanded their offer, establishing the IM Properties Communities Fund in 2023 to support community-based organisations throughout the whole of the West Midlands. Inspired by IM Properties' 'Sustainable Futures Framework', groups can apply for up to £3,000 for projects that address one of three themes: People, Place, and Planet. Since its inception two years ago, the IM Properties Communities Fund has supported innovative pilot projects, the procurement of essential equipment, and the development of existing services that have proven to be indispensable. In this year alone we have awarded over £100,000 to 43 local charities and community groups whose work has touched the lives of thousands.

For many participants particularly older adults who had lost partners or were experiencing loneliness—the sessions became a consistent source of warmth. connection, and emotional wellbeing. Weekly gatherings offered structure and something to look forward to, providing a safe, inclusive, and welcoming space. All participants—volunteers and attendees alike—benefited from the opportunity to share skills, create friendships, and come together as a community.

For older people living in Sandwell, The William Wilson Turner Foundation's weekly 'Soup and Social' became an opportunity to come together, socialise, and enjoy delicious home-cooked soup over the cold winter months. Using food purchased from organisations like Incredible Surplus to reduce food waste, participants were invited to take part in creative craft activities, dance sessions, and contribute to new menu suggestions all while enjoying nutritious soup. The project was made possible with a grant of £2,975 from the IM Properties Community Fund.

With a grant of £3,000, Clothing Coventry have been able to sustain their secondhand clothing delivery service. The grant has enabled Clothing Coventry to support the work of their delivery driver, which will allow them to distribute approximately 15,000 items of clothing over the next 9 months to people in need across the city. Clothes are delivered on a weekly basis to food banks, children's centres, warm hubs, and refugee housing in Coventry, so that vulnerable people have access to goodquality, season-appropriate clothing. The delivery service will be particularly impactful for people living in extreme poverty and those who suffer from health issues who may have difficulty accessing their central hub in Hillfields.

The support we have received from IM Properties has been invaluable in our efforts to unlock the limitless potential of grassroots organisations across the region. The involvement of IM Properties' staff in the decision-making process has given them the chance to shape the impact of their donation in line with their own sustainability aims.

Unlocked Funds Bring Bell Green ABC New Ring

Bell Green ABC (Amateur Boxing Club) have been awarded £5,000 after the Foundation joined together with Coventry City Council to unlock dormant assets to benefit the voluntary and community sector in Coventry.

The ringfenced charitable funds, which were donated to the council by philanthropists hundreds of years ago for causes not relevant to today's society, were uncovered by the Foundation in conjunction with the Charity Commission's revitalising trusts initiative, which highlights dormant charity assets that have been lost in the system over long periods of time.

The money has been added to the Foundation's own funds that target improving communities across Coventry, which in-turn create a long-term source of income for the voluntary and community sector in the city.

Bell Green ABC, based at Bell Green Working Men's Club, was the very first recipient of a grant from the funds and has used the £5,000 to purchase a new boxing ring as well as paint to revamp the gym, creating a more welcoming space.

The club was taken over by Damon Croft just last year, and it has since gone from strength to strength, welcoming an increasing number of young people through the door and being a recognised name in the boxing circuit.

Damon hopes that the new ring will see even more local children take up the sport.

I'd like to say a huge thank you to the Heart of England Community Foundation and Coventry City Council for this grant.

Grant Spotlight | Growth Path Services



Pathways to Success

Organisations can apply to the Birmingham and Black Country Communities Fund for up to £3,000 for projects that help to address specific needs in the local area. Grants from the programme are awarded from the earnings of the Foundation's endowment, which is made up of contributions from individuals, private companies, and trusts.

Tackling disadvantage and poor mental health, Growth Path Services are one of 44 charities and community-based organisations that have been awarded through the fund this year. With a focus on supporting vulnerable young people aged 16-29 into education and employment, Growth Path Services work in some of Birmingham's largest areas of deprivation:

Aston, Erdington, Kingstanding, Lozells, and Nechells.

In March 2025, Growth Path Services were awarded £2,000 to provide tailored resilience training sessions for young people who are not in education, employment or training. The person-centered sessions sought to equip participants with valuable life skills in addition to real qualifications that will uplift them and encourage them to become independent. Delivered

by Birmingham Mind, the resilience training sessions focus on stress management and emotion regulation, teaching participants how to cope with stress, difficult emotions, and personal issues. The project aligns with Growth Path Services' mission to break

the cycle of poverty by enabling young people from disadvantaged backgrounds to achieve their own success.

It can be difficult for young people, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds,

to openly discuss
their mental health,
but Growth Path
Services' training
model is tried and
tested. The resilience
training sessions

of an 'Introduction to
Construction' course, which

employment and training since its inception. In addition to the qualifications received, upon finishing the course, participants are given references to show other potential employers they have what it takes to succeed.

I would explode when things got tough, at my mum, my girlfriend, anyone around me. Teachers, anyone. I didn't see any other solution. I needed to calm down and step away. Better that than just kicking off. That behaviour was getting me nowhere. I'm going to use this toolbox all the time.

with it in ways that don't make

Happy Healthy Families

Sonrisa Arts deliver creative music and dance workshops in Warwickshire, with a particular focus on offering people living in underserved communities the chance to engage with the arts. Following the success of their pilot project in Camp Hill, Nuneaton, Sonrisa Arts were awarded £3,000 from the Coventry, Warwickshire and Solihull Communities Fund to deliver additional workshops for children and their parents. The project, aptly named 'Happy Healthy Families', combined exciting interactive performances with the opportunity for families to connect with each other in a fun and welcoming environment.

Founded in 2022, Sonrisa Arts seek to improve people's mental health through the transformative power of the creative arts. They work with vulnerable people within the local community, ensuring that those in need have access to the arts regardless of their health or financial position. The project specifically targeted young children aged 3-6, as well as their parents and carers.



One parent said:

"I'm so happy that we can access this for free as otherwise we couldn't do it."

Based in Nuneaton — historically one of the most deprived towns in the whole of Warwickshire — the sensory workshops addressed barriers to mental health services by allowing families to take part in the project free of charge. Often, some of the most vulnerable people in our local communities lack the access to mental health support. In this project alone, Sonrisa Arts reached 78 children and their families, using the creative arts as a tool to captivate the children, aid their development, and allow their relationships with their parents and carers to blossom. They discovered the project had a significant impact on children with additional needs, and that children learning English as an additional language could engage with their peers more confidently.



Observing the joy on children's faces when they experienced the magic of the theatre for the first time and watching the bond between parent and child develop during the workshops as they danced and moved together showed us the power dance and live music have to improve health and wellbeing.

To wrap up the project, participants were invited to a special performance of 'Dance in the Dark' at the Albany Theatre in Coventry. Created by the Sonrisa Arts team, the show helps children to explore their fear of the dark through music, dance, and imagination.

Grant Spotlight | Coventry Resting Spaces



Safe Havens for People in Need

Dedicated to making Coventry the UK's first restful city, Coventry Resting Spaces have made it their mission to provide free, accessible quiet spaces across the city centre for those in need.

People with hidden disabilities or mental health issues often find it challenging to overcome the overwhelming pressures caused by loud, bustling public areas. When dealing with anxiety, sensory overload, or chronic pain, having a designated safe environment to go to will enable many of these people to better participate in their local community.


Coventry Resting Spaces were awarded £2,216 for the development of a sensory room within Coventry's central library. Following the feedback they have received from people with lived experience of autism, the grant has allowed them to purchase



packs of sensory equipment which can be loaned out to people in the community. Sensory tools such as fidget toys and ear defenders can be the key to relieving stress and anxiety. This new lending scheme will ensure this equipment is available for free to anyone in need.

Ashley Kirton, the founder of Coventry Resting Spaces, has lived experience of Asperger's syndrome. Without access to a designated quiet space, Ashley would duck into shop doorways or public toilets to try to bring his anxiety down. He felt inspired to create safe havens across the city following the COVID-19 pandemic, hoping to reduce isolation for people who struggle with sensory overload and help increase access to local services within the city centre.

This project was funded through the
Coventry, Warwickshire and Solihull
Communities Fund, which was designed
to support local community solutions
that tackle disadvantage and promote
health and wellbeing. Coventry locals can
find purpose-built resting spaces at the
Central Library, Saint Mary's Guildhall, The
Herbert Art Gallery, FarGo Village, and the
Methodist Central Hall.
